Devotions – August 2012

The Statement

^{AC 13:16} Standing up, Paul motioned with his hand and said: “Men of Israel and you Gentiles who worship God, listen to me! ¹⁷ The God of the people of Israel chose our fathers; he made the people prosper during their stay in Egypt, with mighty power he led them out of that country, ¹⁸ he endured their conduct for about forty years in the desert, ¹⁹ he overthrew seven nations in Canaan and gave their land to his people as their inheritance. ²⁰ All this took about 450 years. “After this, God gave them judges until the time of Samuel the prophet. ²¹ Then the people asked for a king, and he gave them Saul son of Kish, of the tribe of Benjamin, who ruled forty years. ²² After removing Saul, he made David their king. He testified concerning him: ‘I have found David son of Jesse a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do.’(NIV)

The Teaching

King David made several big mistakes in his life. Yet he was called a man after God's own heart and was mightily used by the Lord to lead the Israelites. What set him apart was the priority he placed on his relationship with the heavenly Father.

David delighted in knowing God and sought Him earnestly. Writing, "My soul thirsts for You, my flesh yearns for You in a dry and weary land," he declared that God's love was better than life and pledged to praise Him all his days ([Ps. 63:1, 3-4](#)).

David viewed the world from a God-centered perspective. He marveled at the Lord's creative power in the world, relied on Him for protection and strength, and proclaimed allegiance in his writings. He also prayed fervently and frequently, lifting requests in the morning and expectantly awaiting a response ([Ps. 5:3](#)). At night he'd continue communing with God ([Ps. 63:6](#)).

Both actions--praying and meditating on God's character--fueled his trust in the Lord. His faith sustained him throughout life: when he was a shepherd boy protecting sheep from attacks by wild animals, a young man defeating the giant Goliath, and the nation's anointed leader escaping King Saul's murderous plans. Whatever his circumstances, he sought the Lord and gave priority to their relationship.

The Psalms record David's desire to know God and be known by Him. He sought the Lord's guidance through prayer and had a heart for Him. Jesus invites us to draw near and spend our time learning from Him ([Matt. 11:28-29](#)). Have you made following Christ the priority of your life?

NSW State Championship Race Meeting – Sydney Motorsport Park (formerly Eastern Creek Raceway) – 9/10 June 2012.

Round 3 of the NSW State Championship for 2012 was held over the weekend of 9 & 10 June 2012. This was the first race meeting to be held on the new extended track layout at Sydney Motorsport Park.

On the Friday before the weekend I headed out to the track for some practice. I needed some more time in the car and I wanted to check out the new track extension before Qualifying on the Saturday morning. I missed the first Practice session due to some last minute work needing to be done on the car, but made it to the track well in time for the second session. It seemed like a lot of other competitors also had the idea of checking out the new layout because the paddock area was quite full with very few spaces left to park.

The new layout takes in most of the old circuit until you reach the old turn 6, over the back of the complex, nearest to the dragstrip. Whereas the old turn 6 was a slight right kink just before the 90 degree left turn 7, the new turn 6 is a more gradual left turn. However, not long after exiting this corner you have quite a sharp right corner (new turn 7), followed by a short uphill straight then a left and right. After this you have a more gradual left sweeper going downhill. This then tightens up and then you are put into a tight hairpin turn to the left, followed by a tight right corner going uphill. This takes you up to the old Corporate Hill. For the Holden HQs, we are in second gear from the start of the new turn 6 until we reach the new turn 13, which takes you onto the old part of the track. I heard that the Sports Sedans were using first gear through the hairpin.

As usual at this track, the Holden HQs were scheduled for the last session on the programme, but we did manage to complete about 5 or 6 laps of the circuit in session 2. Our third session was cut short, most of us didn't complete two laps, when a ute from the construction site on the hill between the track and the dragstrip, decided to roll down the hill, through the spectator fence between corners 5 & 6, jump the track and plough into the concrete barrier on the inside of the track. Initially it was thought someone may have been in the ute, I heard that it was either a Ford Ranger or Mazda BT50 (same ute, from the same factory in Thailand), but it was empty. The rest of our session was cancelled.

Practice session 4 didn't even allow the Holden HQs onto the track as an incident in the previous session for another category required some track work. We were queued up in Pit Lane watching the sun go down and our chances of more track time diminish when we were told to drive back to the paddock as it was now too late.

On Saturday morning we were the last category to have a qualifying session, just prior to the lunch break. The car went okay, but I was still coming to grips with the new circuit, having only about 6 laps on the Friday to learn it. One of the faster cars, Garry Foreman car 56, passed me under brakes in turn 2 and I followed him until we got just past the new turn 7 when he suddenly slowed and I had to brake quickly to avoid hitting him. I noticed a puff of steam coming from under his bonnet. Unfortunately I had another car, Darren Meyer car 72, one of the usual front runners, right behind me at the time and he thumped me in the rear. Anyway, as seems to be usual, I qualified towards the back of the field for race 1 in the afternoon.

Race 1 went okay, I passed a few cars at the start, but the car had a miss in the engine about half way down the main straight on every lap. This problem caused me to lose a few positions as cars passed me while the car was not going well. A few drivers had problems and did not finish the race, so I inherited a few spots, finishing 23rd out of 28 starters. Race 2, on Sunday morning, was pretty much the same although I was passed by a few of the faster non finishers from Race 1 but still managed to complete the race in 20th position. The misfire still persisted, despite changing to new spark plugs and leads.

Before Race 3 Pedro Marusic, who was not competing for the weekend, checked my car to find the miss. He pulled the top off the carby and found that the float level was too low. Also, the brass seat (where the needle goes into) was a 6 cylinder one, where I should have been using a V8 one. (The part is the same, but the V8 type has a slightly larger hole). Once these problems were fixed, the misfire disappeared and the car ran much better for the entire race. I tried to keep up with the pack of 6 cars just ahead of me, but they gradually eased away. It seems that I need to work on my braking and cornering speed to keep up. Anyhow, I finished the last race but did not get the results as it was getting dark by then and packing up to leave was a priority.

Thanks go to Pedro Marusic for sorting out the misfire, and to Andrew Woodall from Penrith Muffler Man for supplying a new hotdog muffler to replace the bent one from the previous meeting.
