Devotions – August 2018

Introduction

Finally, the long-awaited Saviour had arrived. But there was still more waiting. The baby Jesus grew up as a Jewish boy who lived in a normal family, but with hints as to his greater purpose. As was customary for new-born Jewish boys, he was presented at the temple for circumcision when he was 8 days old. While he was there, Simeon the priest and Anna the prophetess both pronounced blessings over him and acknowledged him as the Saviour. When he was 12 years old, when he was in Jerusalem with his family for Passover, he was found at the temple with the teachers after the rest of his family had left for home, saying to his parents “Did you not know that I would be about my Father’s business?”

Finally, the time came for him to start his public ministry. His cousin, John, who was also born miraculously to Mary’s cousin Elizabeth in her old age, was teaching a baptism of repentance. He was the one that Isaiah had prophesied about 700 years earlier, “A voice of one calling in the desert, Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all mankind will see God’s salvation”. When Jesus was about 30 years old he presented himself to John for baptism. As he was being baptised the Holy Spirit descended on him, pronouncing, “You are my Son whom I love; with you I am well pleased”. After this the Spirit led him into the desert where he fasted and was tempted by the devil for 40 days.

After this he went about teaching, healing the sick and driving out demons. The people were amazed at this teaching and his miracles, at times being driven out of town due to his popularity.

The Story

Luke 5:17-26 ¹⁷ One day Jesus was teaching, and Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there. They had come from every village of Galilee and from Judea and Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal the sick. ¹⁸ Some men came carrying a paralysed man on a mat and tried to take him into the house to lay him before Jesus. ¹⁹ When they could not find a way to do this because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and lowered him on his mat through the tiles into the middle of the crowd, right in front of Jesus.

²⁰ When Jesus saw their faith, he said, “Friend, your sins are forgiven.”

²¹ The Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, “Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?”

²² Jesus knew what they were thinking and asked, “Why are you thinking these things in your hearts? ²³ Which is easier: to say, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Get up and walk’? ²⁴ But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.” So he said to the paralysed man, “I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home.” ²⁵ Immediately he stood up in front of them, took what he had been lying on and went home praising God. ²⁶ Everyone was amazed and gave praise to God. They were filled with awe and said, “We have seen remarkable things today.” (NIV)
